A Survey of Select Oklahoma Libraries to Determine the Usefulness of an Index to Oklahoma Periodicals

Project Report, Fall 2000

Overview

In May 2000, the Amigos Bibliographic Council awarded the Oklahoma State University Library a \$300 grant to survey select Oklahoma Libraries to determine the usefulness of an index to selected Oklahoma publications. The OSU Library successfully completed the survey project in October 2000.

The project began in December 1999 when librarians at the Oklahoma State University Library met to discuss various projects that might improve access to library materials. After some deliberation and with input from a number of different sources, the group decided to conduct a feasibility survey of Oklahoma libraries to determine whether or not compiling an index of Oklahoma publications would be useful for Oklahoma library users. A previous index, the *Red River Index*, was produced in the early 1980s edited by Andrew Peters. After talking with, the OSU Library's Director of Library Development and Outreach, Jennifer Paustenbaugh, the group decided to apply for an Amigos Fellowship Program grant.

Proposal Highlights

Abstract

The proposal abstract outlined the distribution of a survey to select Oklahoma libraries to determine whether or not a need existed for an index to selected Oklahoma publications. If the survey results showed that an index proved feasible, the actual creation of such an index would be explored.

Objectives

The three objectives in the proposal included:

- 1) To determine which periodicals are published in and include information about the state of Oklahoma
- 2) To determine which of the above periodicals are most widely used by Oklahoma libraries
- 3) To attract additional funding for the creation of a Web-based index to Oklahoma periodicals, which may be accessed through the Oklahoma State University Library Web page

Strategy

The Strategy outlined the steps the group would take to prepare the survey including gathering information on what publications to include in the survey and determining to which Oklahoma libraries the survey would be sent.

Schedule and Report

Work on the project was to begin in June 2000 and conclude during the early spring of 2001. The final report was to be completed in March 2001.

Project

The following pages describe how the project was accomplished.

May 2000

After Amigos awarded the grant, the project group met in May 2000. During this meeting an initial plan of action was discussed outlining who would work on various aspects of the project.

The group for this project was composed of four library faculty members. The group leader determined which libraries would be surveyed using the *American Library Directory*, 52nd edition (1999-2000). A Microsoft Access database (available upon request) was created and contains the name and address of the library, the contact person (usually the library director), phone and fax numbers, population served (public libraries only), and any additional notes. The criteria for inclusion were public libraries with user populations of 15,000 or more, libraries located at two-year, four-year, and graduate institutions of higher education, and other special libraries throughout the state of Oklahoma.

All four group members reviewed and selected the publications that would be included in the survey using the *Gale Directory of Publications and Broadcast Media* and *Ulrich's International Periodicals Directory*. Using this information, a Microsoft Access database (available upon request) was created containing general information about the publications including title, sponsoring organization, address of publication, frequency of publication, and general notes about the publication's subject matter. The group met several times to discuss various aspects of the grant proposal. Issues that were raised included deciding which format of publications to include in the survey such as newsletters, brochures, pamphlets, and university and college magazines. We also discussed whether or not each publication fit our criteria that it be published in and about the state of Oklahoma.

June-July 2000

The Catalog librarian assisted the group leader in preparing the cover letter to accompany the survey, while the Documents librarians wrote the survey questions. In preparing the survey and the cover letter, the group met several times to determine which questions to ask on the survey, the survey format, and the contents and wording of the cover letter. The survey and cover letter were then given to several other library employees to examine to determine whether the wording and intent of both the letter and survey were clear. Comments and suggestions by this test group were then incorporated into the final survey and cover letter. A copy of the final survey and cover letter are attached as Appendix A and B, respectively.

August-September 2000

The first round of surveys was sent to the selected Oklahoma libraries during the middle of August with a request that the survey be placed in the mail by September 1, 2000. Seventy-seven letters were sent and 48 were returned (a 62 percent return rate). A follow-up mailing was sent during September containing the original survey and cover letter with an additional cover letter (Appendix C) explaining that this is "a friendly reminder that we have yet to receive your completed form." This letter contained a request that the survey be mailed by October 1. Thirty-one letters were sent and 15 were returned (a 48 percent return rate).

October 2000

In the middle of October, after a majority of the surveys were returned, the results were compiled, as shown in Appendix D and E. Appendix D is a copy of the original survey containing the number of libraries that responded indicating marks in the various categories. Appendix E contains those publications suggested for inclusion in an index to Oklahoma publications by the survey participants. As stated in the original cover letter, a summary of the results was e-mailed to those participants requesting them. This e-mail is attached as Appendix F .

Discussion

Success of the proposal required a 75 percent return rate. With both of the mailings, the return rate was 81 percent. The survey showed that many Oklahoma libraries have current subscriptions to four publications -- The Chronicles of Oklahoma {53}, The Oklahoma Observer {37}, Oklahoma Today Magazine {48}, and Outdoor Oklahoma {52} and that these publications are used regularly by Oklahoma library users.

Persimmon Hill also proved to be a popular publication with 23 libraries, having a subscription. The results also showed that many people are interested in the indexing of a select few Oklahoma publications, most notably the Chronicles of Oklahoma. Seventy-one percent of the returned surveys indicated that a publication that indexed periodical articles about Oklahoma would be useful. Seventy-three percent indicated that if such an index existed, these periodicals would be used more frequently (Appendix F). Finally, many libraries indicated that these publications are indexed both by in-house publications and commercial indexes (Appendix D).

Evaluation

Objectives

The first objective was to determine which periodicals are published in and include information about the state of Oklahoma. This objective was successfully met using the Gale Directory of Publications and Broadcast Media and Ulrich's International Periodicals Directory .Although the Red River Index, the OCLC WorldCat database, and the Oklahoma Statewide catalog were mentioned in the original grant, Ulrich's and Gale were the primary sources consulted.

The second objective was to determine which of the above periodicals are most widely used by Oklahoma libraries. The survey results clearly demonstrated that the four most frequently consulted publications in Oklahoma libraries are *The Chronicles of Oklahoma* The Oklahoma Observer, Oklahoma Today Magazine, and Outdoor Oklahoma.

The third objective was to attract additional funding for the creation of a Web-based index to Oklahoma periodicals, which may be accessed through the Oklahoma State University Library Web page. The project group will submit a proposal in February of 2001 to the Amigos Fellowship program requesting funding to begin the indexing of the four most frequently consulted Oklahoma publications listed above.

Strategy

The strategy outlined in the grant proposal was followed, although the timeline for the project was shortened.

Future Approaches

Contingent on funding, the group would like to produce an index of the four most frequently consulted Oklahoma publications determined by the survey. This index would be Web-based and searchable from any computer with Internet access.

Conclusions/Recommendations

Overall, the project was a success. The first two objectives outlined in the original grant proposal were met and the group will prepare and submit a proposal to Amigos in the spring of 2000 to obtain additional funding to continue the project. We determined which publications are published in and include information about Oklahoma (Objective 1), and through the survey, we ascertained which publications Oklahoma library users (Objective 2) most frequently consult. The group plans to seek additional funding in the spring to begin the actual indexing of the top four Oklahoma publications determined by this survey (Objective 3).

In reflecting on the way in which the survey was administered, the group recommends libraries and their corresponding surveys be numbered before being sent out so a more accurate account of the returned surveys can be made before a second mailing is sent. The group would also ask the Library's Administrative Office to track the cost of postage for the returned surveys. Finally, the group would test the survey and cover letter on a group of people outside of the library to clarify the terminology used.
